Waconia Knight - Serving Our Country Overseas

From Nick Kehtel, Council 2506 Faith and Social Media Director, and National Guard Officer.

Hello to all my brother Knights. I pray that all is well with you, your families, and your efforts to serve our parish. I'm happy to report that thus far my deployment has been going well, although it has yet to truly begin. I left Minnesota on October 12th, and thus far have been training with my unit in the beautiful and dry climate of a training range north of El Paso, Texas. This has been both physically and mentally challenging, but has also presented a great opportunity to grow in fellowship with the other deploying Soldiers. I will likely be overseas by the time you're reading this, and I can share that I will be first stationed in Jordan at an installation only about 50 miles from the traditionally accepted site of Jesus's baptism along the Jordan river. One of the things I've found most interesting (and concerning) is just how chaotic and tragic the situation in the Middle East remains currently, especially in Syria and northern Iraq. The hard truth that has been reinforced to me in these last few weeks during various briefings and trainings, building upon the geopolitical awakening I experienced as a child on September 11th, 2001, is that there remains malicious forces who murder, maim, and destroy

innocent life which gets in the way of their political and ideological goals. These militias and radical jihadist forces active in the Middle East currently, including ISIL and other terrorist groups, may not be in the news much in Western nations anymore, but I can assure you they continue to wreak horror on innocent and helpless people of every faith wherever and whenever they can. While this sad state of affairs is not something I share lightly, it does reinforce to me the importance of sacrifices being made for the greater good. Leaving my wife and daughter to deploy is without question the most emotionally difficult thing I've ever done, but it is a sacrifice made substantially easier when I weigh it against the small contribution I might make, God willing, towards improving the lives of those currently living without hope.

One of the spiritual exercises I am engaging in while deployed is reading the Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen's "Wartime Prayer Book". Written in 1943 while Allied forces prepared for the liberation of Europe from the crushing heel of Axis occupation, I've found the lessons and spiritual guidance of Archbishop Sheen as fruitful today as I'm sure the Christian warriors of the greatest generation did. As Knights, we are called to "sacrifice" constantly for the betterment of our communities, and as I continue to reflect on this theme, I would like to leave you all with one of the passages I've found most comforting and encouraging for the mission I now finally am beginning - I feel it is as applicable to my military mission as it is to our mission as Knights:

"I shall make any sacrifices to which my country may call me - serve at the front, buy bonds, labor long hours in factory or home, accept inconveniences - in reparations for my sins. There is a thrill in paying off a debt, and we are all in debt to God! 'Forgive us our trespasses,' that is, our debts. The thief crucified on the right hand of our Lord offered his cross in reparation for his sins; 'And we indeed justly; for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." In one day he blotted out his sins: 'Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise". I will sacrifice and suffer gladly that, through the example of my patience, others may come to know something of the blessedness of having found God. We live in a universe where the good or evil that one does has social repercussions. A stone thrown into the ocean affects even the most distant shore. Doctors graft skin from the body to the face when it is burned; they transfuse blood from one member of society to another. Now, if it is possible to graft skin, why is it not possible to graft prayer; if it is possible to transfuse blood, why is it not possible to transfuse sacrifice? The sacrifices I make can therefore be applied to others: to a friend in battle; to a wife back home; to a brother who has been away from the sacraments for years; to a sister who has a bad marriage; to little children, that they may grow up as worthy children of God; and above all for the peace of the world."

Thank you for all the kind words of support and prayers - they mean so very much to me and my family. I hope to write an update every month to share, so until the next newsletter, I pray that God may bless you all and your important sacrificial mission to our beloved Church and community. — Nick Kehtel, Special Operations Joint Task Force — Operation Inherent Resolve
