Waconia Knight - Serving Our Country Overseas

From Nick Kehtel, Council 2506 Faith and Social Media Director, and National Guard Officer.

Hello to my brother Knights! I am writing to you this month on Easter Sunday; Christ is risen - Alleluia, Alleluia! I've had a wonderful Holy Week here in Jordan. Thanks to having a Chaplain Priest close by, I was able to attend Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil services over the past few days. I was truly blessed to have the opportunity to fully celebrate the Paschal Triduum. The new Priest here is an Army Reserve Chaplain from the Diocese of Charleston, and is originally from Poland. He's made the entire Lenten observance and Easter celebration one for great reflection, penitence, and reverence, all for which I am most grateful.

As you may have seen in the news, it's been a busy past few weeks here in the Middle East. I'm sad to report that the contractor who was tragically killed in the Iranian-backed militia strike in northern Syria was working at a base which our Task Force operates out of. The evening of that incident I was in our Joint Operations Center all night working through our battle drills and managing information flow from the ground units up to our higher headquarters. Even with all our technology and surveillance capability, it gave me new meaning to the phrase "fog of war" with how chaotic and inaccurate information reporting in a combat situation can be. With their strikes and our counterstrikes over the course of several nights, that week was without question the most exhausting and intense my time here in the Joint Headquarters has been. I remain in awe of the capability of our Special Forces personnel operating in the field, the professionalism of the people I work with in the headquarters, and I ask that you keep us all in your prayers as we work through this uptick in violence and threats to US and coalition personnel.

This being the month of Ramadan for Muslims has meant that our off-base activities have been limited. While Jordan's government and its people have shown themselves to be very tolerant and welcoming, they still observe fairly strict rules for everyone in the country during Ramadan – whether Muslim or not. Anyone seen in public eating, drinking (even water), smoking, chewing gum, or in non-conservative clothing could be subject to a large fine and up to 30 days in jail. Of course, on our military bases we are able to continue on our normal lives, but Ramadan has meant that many of the cultural/historical site excursions I've been fortunate enough to go on have been put on hiatus until the Islamic holy month is over. I will say that I have been impressed with the dedication of our Muslim brothers and sisters in their daily fasting. I know it sometimes can seem hard to just remember to not eat meat on Fridays during Lent, but imagine needing to go a month with only eating and drinking anything before sunrise or after sunset? As with everything, God works in mysterious ways to teach us lessons and help us to reflect on our own devotion to him – the example of our Muslim hosts here frequently made me think on how I might better commit myself to fasting, abstinence, and overall personal sacrifices during the Lenten season as a Christian.

I am excited for all the wonderful events our Council has upcoming. I pray for your continued success in serving our Parish and community. I know that the 100 Year Anniversary celebration

planning is well underway and I am looking forward to attending that with you all to mark the dedication of those built our Council into what it is today. May God bless all that you do, and I thank you all for your continued prayers and support to me and my family. Until next month, may you and your families rejoice in this Easter celebration – truly he is risen! Alleluia, Alleluia!
