To say I am excited would be an understatement, but I remain focused on finishing my time here as strong as I can to set the new team replacing me and my Minnesota teammates up for success as they begin their tour.

I hope everyone was able to enjoy their 4th of July holiday. It was a fun and ironic experience celebrating Independence Day while in the company of our British military coalition partners. There was a lot of good-natured joking here on base, with them wishing us Americans a "Happy Treason Day" and a number of festivities that featured US vs UK teams playing various games against each other. It was a relaxing and enjoyable day for our group here and certainly an Independence Day I'll never forget.

I appreciate that you've allowed me to share my thoughts and experiences with you in the monthly newsletter while I've been deployed. I also want to take a moment and thank the Council again for the supportive words and prayers throughout this mobilization, as well as the care package you sent. Even though I've been far from home, being able to stay in touch via email with everything the Knights have been active with in our parish has been one of the things that has truly helped me still feel connected with home.
