


Novena for Life at St Joseph School



From Nick Kehtel, Council 2506 Faith and Social Media Director, and National Guard Officer.

Hello to my brother Knights! I hope your May is off to wonderful start. I know there's been lots of great activities and programs either just completed, ongoing, or upcoming, and I am keeping all your efforts in my prayers. I am joining with you in praying the Novena for Life this month, and I hope that this year's novena is a spiritually successful one for you, your families, and our parish community.

This past month was a steady one for me. Nothing overly exciting to report (which is a good thing), and it's been a good opportunity to focus on refining processes and wrapping up some projects that have been taking a back seat due to operational activity since the start of the year. As we head towards the month of June, our entire team is focused on the coming change of command as we prepare to welcome a new commanding general to oversee the task force. In addition to a new general, most of the core staff positions also swap out in June, and there will be a lot of new faces and names to learn heading into my final months of deployment, but I am excited to meet the new team and work with them in the ongoing mission we have here in the Levant.

As it stands now, I am expecting to be back in Minnesota sometime in mid-August. I know one of the things my wife, Annie, is looking forward to most in having me home is to assist in wrangling up our energetic daughter. Eloise is almost 14 months old now and continues to find new ways to keep her mom busy! One of the fun things both Annie and I have been doing to keep ourselves occupied over my deployment is planning a trip to take together in early September after being apart for so long - we're planning to visit Ireland, Scotland, and London for a little more than 2 weeks, and can't wait to explore a part of the world we both thoroughly appreciate and have ancestral connections to.

Speaking of the UK, I know many Americans might find it silly, but it was a really great experience celebrating the coronation of King Charles III this past weekend with all the UK service members I have the privilege to be deployed with here. With it being the first one in over 70 years, they made a great effort to put on a big watch party for the whole base to enjoy in, and most everyone did. Many of our senior officers are from the UK armed forces, and several of them know or have served at one point with members of the Royal Family. It was a special opportunity to be able to share in this important event with our British brothers and sisters in arms while they tuned in and celebrated this historic ceremony for their country while deployed in service to it.

It's hard to believe that I have less than one hundred days until I'm home, but the work we do here is ongoing and remains important and will keep me busy right up until I leave. Until next month, please keep me and my fellow service members here in your prayers as I move towards these final months overseas. I pray for your continued success as a Council and am looking forward to rejoining you soon!
