Waconia Knight - Serving Our Country Overseas

Greetings to all of my brother Knights! I hope things are going well for all of you and your families. It was great to read about the Respect Life breakfast and the success had there, and I am wishing you luck with the Faith-In-Action Blood Drive and the Fish Fry's beginning later this month. I want to especially thank our council for the generous care package you all sent! There was great appreciation from not just me, but my whole team for the coffee and food-items! The little comforts from home can make all the difference sometimes, and certainly offer a nice change from our normal dining facility food.

January was a good month here. We've been busy with efforts in Iraq and Syria to continue the fight against ISIS/Daesh. It seems not a day goes by where there isn't some strike or raid by either the US or our Coalition partners against ISIS, and there is constantly a threat by Iranian-sponsored terrorist networks towards US and partner forces throughout the Levant. While I am fortunate to be assigned to a headquarters unit in a mostly stable and safe country such as Jordan, we don't take for granted that the Special Operations personnel we support are in harms way on a daily basis and that it can sometimes be where things feel safest that you are

the most vulnerable. I ask that you keep the safety of our military personnel here in your prayers.

I had the opportunity earlier in January to go on a sacred sites trip which our chaplain organizes. There were about 25 of us from the team who participated, and we visited Bethany Beyond the Jordan, the site of Jesus's Baptism on the Jordan River, and Mt. Nebo, from whose summit Moses viewed the Promised Land at the end of his life.

Bethany Beyond the Jordan was a wonderful spiritual experience. The remains of an early Byzantine-era church built along the then path of the river mark site where early Christians understood the site of the baptism to have occurred. Time and erosion have led to the river in modern times flowing several hundred meters from the original site of the baptism, but there remains a small amount of pooling water at the original site along the historical river. Having just this past year celebrated my daughter's own baptism at St. Joseph's, the spiritual and sacramental connection of this visit was profound.

Mt. Nebo was about a 35-minute drive away from the baptism site and about a 4,000ft ascent from the Jordan river. The climb up the terrain was beautiful. Mt. Nebo has been the site of a Byzantine-era church from the 4th century, and the modern site is under the care of a group of Franciscan friars as a part of the Custody of the Holy Land. The summit is serene, with beautiful views of the surrounding countryside and a clear view of Israel. The modern church built by the Franciscans was recently completed and incorporates the archeological remains of the historical church, including the pillars, altars, and mosaics. The grounds offered a wonderful opportunity to walk around in meditation and prayer.

About a week after my visit to the two sacred sites, I had the opportunity to attend a Melkite Greek Catholic mass celebrated by a local Melkite Catholic priest. As one of the Eastern Catholic Churches in full Communion with the Holy See, the Melkite Greek Catholic Church has a large presence in the Levant, especially in Syria, Lebanon, and Jordan. It was a wonderful experience to participate in a different expression of our universal faith, and the Byzantine Rite of the mass, with its liturgical reverence and embrace of the more mystical aspects of our faith, was a welcome blessing.

Each day here brings me new experiences and connection with new people and cultures – whether from our Jordanian hosts, our Coalition partners, or the US military personnel from across our country. But each day also brings me closer to home, and being back with my wife and daughter is without question the day I am most looking forward to. I will continue to pray for all the efforts of the Knights, and I look forward to hearing more soon about all of the great activities you have dedicated yourselves and your time to. God bless you all!
