History of the Waconia Knights of Columbus Council 2506:

The Waconia Knights of Columbus has been a cornerstone of community service for decades. At the heart of its success are the longstanding members who have selflessly dedicated their time, talents, and commitment to the organization. These individuals stand as beacons of light, embodying the spirit of faith, service, and camaraderie that the Knights of Columbus hold dear.

Throughout its history, the Knights of Columbus has provided an avenue for men to come together in pursuit of shared values and a common mission. As time has passed, certain members have emerged as steadfast pillars of the organization, embodying its core ideals through their actions and contributions. These individuals, often with years of service under their belts, have left an indelible mark on both their local communities and the wider organization.

The stories of these longstanding members paint a vivid picture of dedication and selflessness. Take, for example our very first Grand Knight, F.J Effertz, whose term was marked by building a strong organizational structure. The activities of the Council were directed toward the development of a working financial capital and while each activity did not generate any great profit picture, they were numerous in number. Card parties and plays are examples. Today, 100 years later we honor the work of these Catholic gentlemen who devoted so much of their time to charter and create our council.

In 1926 Grand Knight R.B. Allmann took the helm, and under his leadership, the council expanded its Christian activities through charitable events. A Mexican relief fund was established, and eight families spent a better Christmas that year because of the generosity of the Council. As a result of these new actions, the Council continued to launch a series of charitable activities. In fraternalism an athletic fund of \$250 dollars was initiated which also formed the start of Council picnics. The Council continued to lead fundraising efforts for local schools and organizations. Their tireless commitment to education and community development over the years not only improved the lives of countless individuals but has also inspired younger generations to get involved and make a difference.

In 1932 Grand Knight Tom Burfield took the helm as our country felt the full weight of the Great depression. The financial squeeze was also felt by the Waconia Council as membership dues were dropped to \$5.00 a year. However, attendance at meetings remained fairly constant at 60-100 members each month. These Christian gentlemen were still able to recognize the plight of others keeping their charitable activities going to add financial assistance.

The early 1940's brought on the beginning of World War II as Grand Knight John Scheuble took charge in 1941. The council periodically supported programs for servicemen and prayed earnestly for peace. They also supported bereaved families of members who suffered losses of sons and relatives during the war. Grand Knight Jim Fottral took office in 1943 as the war was becoming more intense. Memorial services continued to be a common occurrence as the war went on. George Kelzer was elected Grand Knight in 1944. Council action was limited because of the war. However, Catholic activity programs were still being carried out with Communion Breakfasts and Soldier support programs were done periodically, and National Patriotic activities were at their

peak. As the war ended and the men were returning home Rufinus Wagener took the helm which brought on a flurry of new Knight candidates. It was not uncommon to have classes of 42 or more enter the program, sometimes twice a year.

In 1953 as John Kunze became Grand Knight, the council saw the beginning of the Drum and Bugle Corps. John also became Waconia's first District Deputy. Many projects were carried out to raise money in support of their young Drum and Bugle Corp for which the council received praises both locally and nationally. In 1956 Frank Sicheneder became Grand Knight and was the principal organizer of the Drum and Bugle Corps while serving as the group's first president.

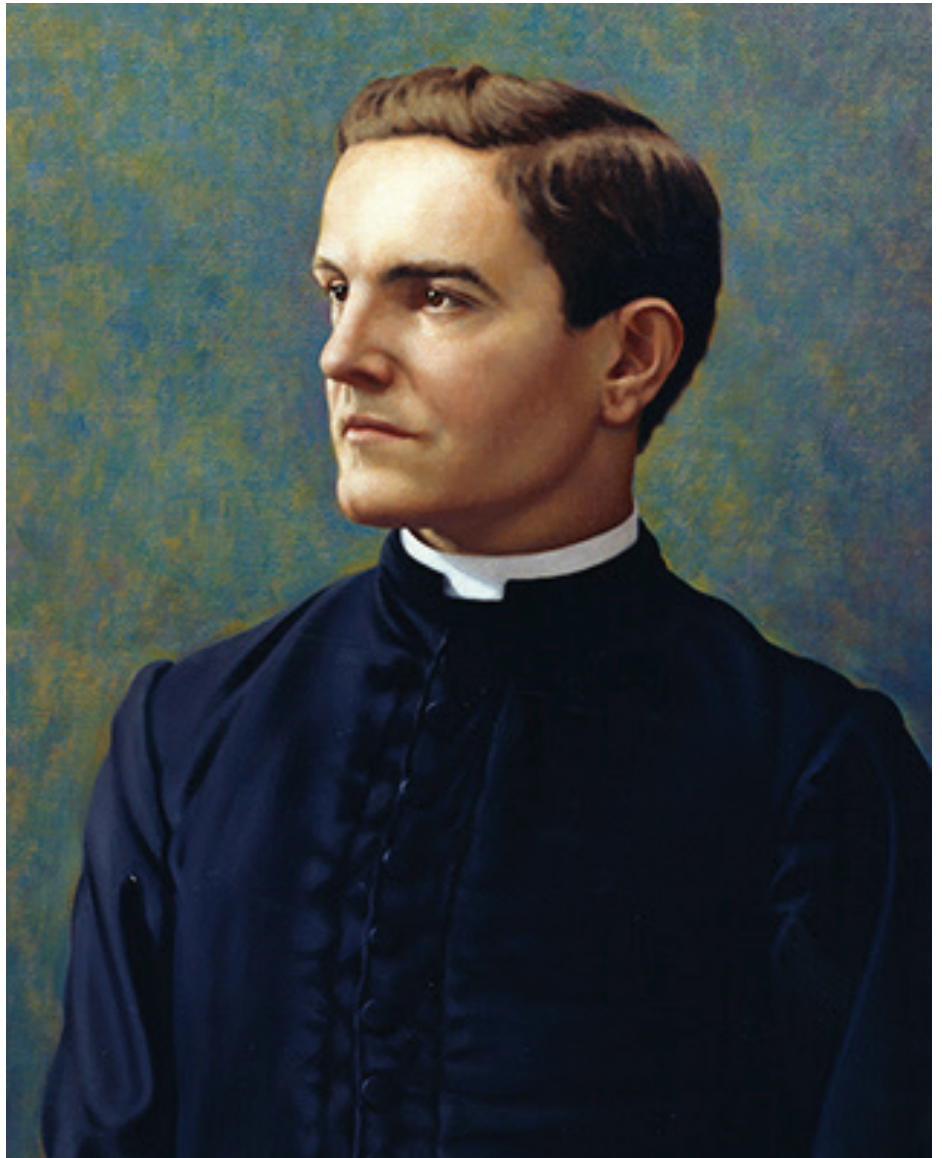


As we entered the 1960's, Grand Knights Nick Schindler, Bernard Malcheski, Jerry Engelen, Don Logelin, Richard Lee, Ray Blissenbach, Art Ehalt, Tom Logelin, Gene Miller, and Pete Ciernia continued on with the long-standing tradition of initiating many programs and activities aimed at growing the council and aiding the community in many ways. During the 1970's, 1980's & 1990's the council continued to flourish under the leadership of Grand Knights Bob Worm, Ray Steinhagen, Jerry Eveslage Ray Blissenbach, Allen Schmitz, Gerald Grote, Henry Steinhagen, Dave Krantz, Dan Steinhagen, Art Ehalt, Ken Jacobs, Roger Buesgens, Ralph Laumann, Len Novak, Ron Rademacher, Jim Klein, Ken Loxtercamp, Tim Leonard, Pat Karn, Joe Niesen, Larry Wirtz, Dennis Buesgens, Steve Wessale, Andy Kleindl, Dan Niesen, Tom Healy, and Rick Polzin who ushered in the council's 75th Anniversary on October 30, 1998.

As we entered a new Millennium in 2000, we also saw a new era beginning to form with the Knights of Columbus. Charitable giving and serving the communities was still at the forefront of our mission as a fraternal order. September 11, 2001, we suffered through a coordinated terrorist attack on American Soil the likes of which this country has not witnessed since the Pearl harbor attacks at the beginning of World War II. The Knights of Columbus were one of the first organizations to offer relief to families of fallen police, firefighters, and emergency personnel. 1.49 Million in immediate aid provided to relatives of fallen emergency personnel through the establishment of the Knights' Heroes Fund, which began distributing checks to family members, regardless of religious affiliation, within two days of the attacks.

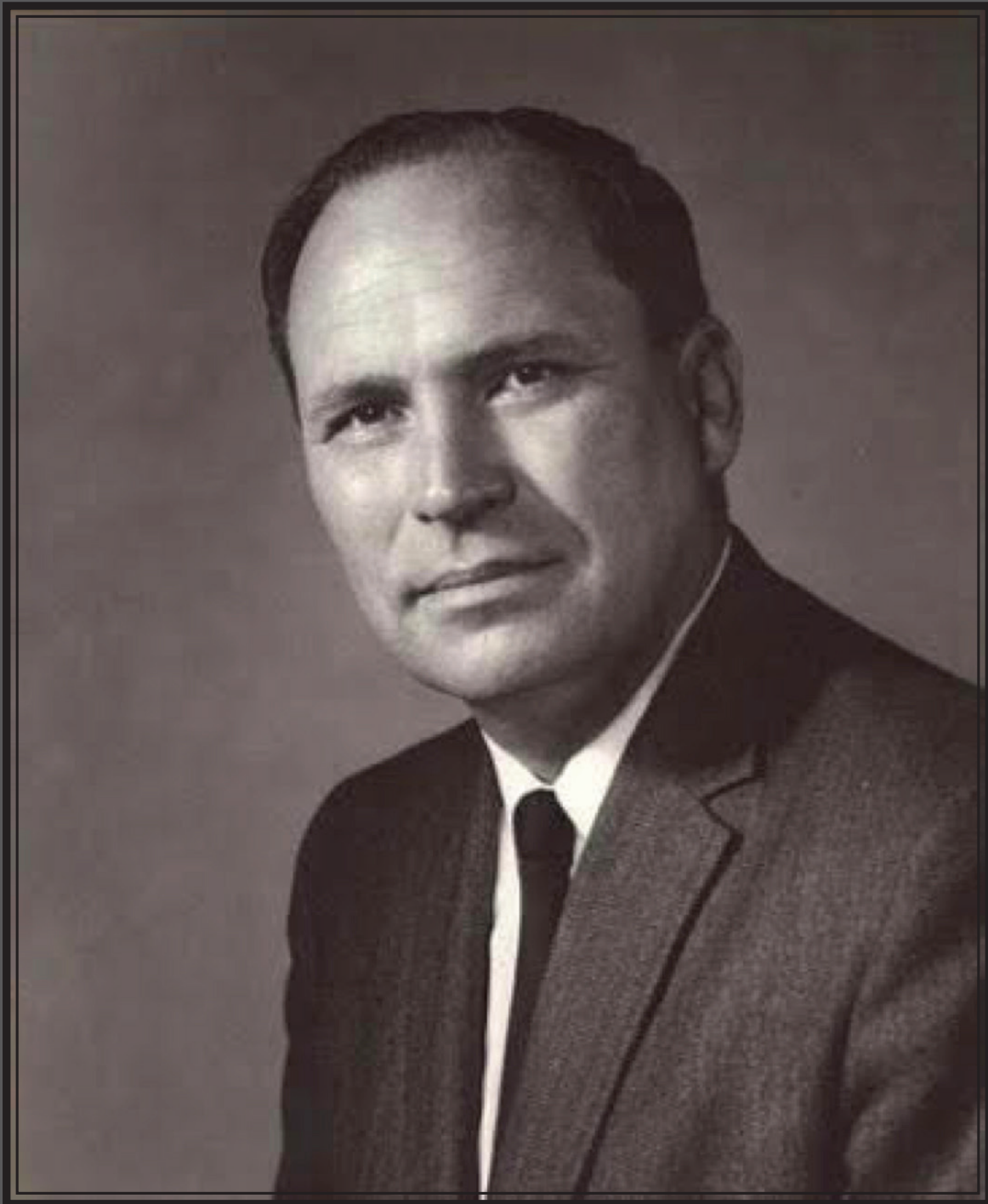
Beginning in 2004, the Knights of Columbus dedicated September 11 as the World Day of Prayer for Peace. Grand Knight Ken Jacobs was at the helm during these trying times when the Knights were at the forefront of prayerful activities for peace. The country was once again united as one while rallying around each other for comfort and peace. The council continued this united front under the continued leadership of Grand Knights Dennis Niccum, Joe Eiden, Dan Steinhagen, Andy Kleindl, Ron Rademacher, and Rick Polzin, who again stepped up to the plate to serve again. Also at the helm during these years were Ted Schugg, Larry Revering, Scott Ryerson, Manny Camilon, Austin Hagen, Patrick Withrow, Ken Gerding, Adam Huges, who served during the pandemic years, John Short, and currently, Chuck Walerius, who will be taking our council into the beginning of our second century of serving families, churches, and communities.

In conclusion, the Knights of Columbus owes much of its success to the tireless efforts of longstanding members who have dedicated their time, talents, and passion to the organization's noble cause. These individuals have transformed the organization from a mere institution into a vibrant community of individuals united by their commitment to service, unity, and fraternity. As we honor their contributions, let us also be inspired by their example and strive to carry their legacy forward, ensuring that the spirit of selfless service continues to thrive within the Knights of Columbus for generations to come.

- 5. Sacramental Gifts - Special gifts to all those receiving the blessed sacraments*





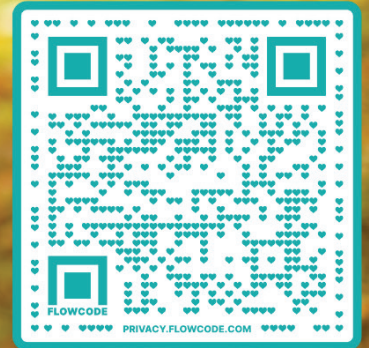
